

Post-Procedural Directions

Proper care following your procedure is required to achieve the best results. Keep in mind the intensity and or unevenness of color, particularly after the initial application of pigment are normal and expected. Review and follow the directions provided for best results.

- With an eyebrow procedure, the skin may be blotted or even washed with soap and water to keep the fluids from forming scab, but only for the 12-14 hours after treatment.
- Ice packs with a barrier to protect the skin may be applied as necessary to reduce swelling.
- Sleeping slightly elevated may assist in the reduction of swelling that is sometimes seen the day of and or the morning after Permanent Cosmetic procedures.
- Do not expose your procedure(s) to dirty or unsanitary conditions. Use cotton tipped applicators to apply medication (Vaseline or Aquaphor).
- Wearing sunglasses outdoors is always a good way to protect new eyeliner and or brows from the environment.
- Blot, wash or wipe the treated area for the first 12 hours. Frequently apply the Vaseline or Aquaphor for a minimum of five days.
- Some tenderness, puffiness, dryness and itching are quite normal to the treatment/healing.
- Do NOT pick, peel, or scratch the treated area. Doing so could encourage your color to heal unevenly and you will risk both scarring and infection.
- Do not apply makeup on the treated area for 72 hours after the procedure. After any eyeliner procedure, use new mascara. DO NOT USE an eyelash curler for at least two weeks after. Eyelash extensions may be applied after two weeks.
- Do not expose your healing skin to hot tubs, saunas, salt water, chlorinated pools, direct shower spray, hot water, skin creams, ointments or lotions other than what you have been instructed to use for the two weeks following your procedure.
- Direct sun exposure, tanning beds and high acid/alkaline exfoliants should be avoided indefinitely. Both are detrimental to the Permanent Cosmetic procedure you have received.
- Good skin and health care are the best insurance for the permanency of permanent cosmetics.
